CODE OF CONDUCT

We here at the Ione Public Library want to make sure that our library is a safe and welcoming environment for everyone. To do this, we ask that you please follow these few rules while using the library.

While on library properties, please:

- Ask for help when you need it.
- Let us know if the library does not have the item or service you want.
- Wear appropriate clothing, including shoes and shirts.
- Keep your conversations (with people in the library and on the phone) and personal electronic devices at a volume that does not disturb others.
- Food & beverages may be consumed anywhere except at the computer terminals.
- Ensure that children under the age of 11 are supervised by an adult.
- Be courteous to other patrons and to staff.

While on library properties, you MAY NOT:

- Destroy, deface, or abuse library property.
- Be disruptive, disorderly, or harass other patrons and/or staff.
- Smoke or use tobacco products.
- Be under the influence of or consume alcohol or illegal substances.
- Sleep or loiter.
- Bring animals (other than service animals or those involved in library programs) into the library or leave animals unattended.
- Bring into the library anything which creates an obstacle or takes up seating.
- Use skateboards, skates, rollerblades, or bicycles.
- Run.
- Engage in sexual conduct as defined in ORS 167.060.
- Disturb other library patrons or staff through extremely poor personal hygiene.
- Conduct surveys or post or distribute printed material without staff approval.
- Panhandle or solicit for sales, charity, religious, or political purposes.

In addition to the above, any violation of Federal, State, or local statutes will be regarded as a violation of library rules. The Ione Public Library reserves the right to eject or suspend library privileges of those individuals who violate Library rules. In addition to the sanctions imposed by the library, further sanctions may be pursued as determined by law.
